2nd Sunday of Advent

Catholic Centre Broadcast

Good morning once again from the chapel at the Catholic Centre where in a few moments the Mass for today, the 2nd Sunday of Advent will be beginning. We welcome you to join in spirit with us here in the offering of the same Mass with which on Friday last we join our Holy Father during his short visit to Hong Kong. Today's broadcast of the Mass won't have the same occasion and solemnity, of course; but if you have seen or heard the celebration on Friday, then perhaps listening again to the same liturgy now as it's celebrated in this small chape on an ordinary Sunday morning, you may be reminded of the message of Pope Paul and our link with him and the whole Church in this and every offering of the Mass. And as he, on all the public occasions like Friday's Mass, likes particularly to see and meet people who are disabled or sick, people who don't normally have a chance of taking part in ordinary life, those of you who are ill and otherwise unable to take part yourself in the celebration of the Eucharist today are particularly welcome to participate with us in our worship and prayer. Today is the second Sunday of the Advent season preparing for Christmas, and so the scripture readings you'll hear are directed towards the coming of Christ. Today is also being observed as Bible Sunday, and as a day of special awareness and concern and prayer about the problems of drug addiction in HK. Mass begins now, with an antiphon and entry song as the celebrant and his assistants approach the altar.

Oreed: After the scripture and homily by Fr Sean Coghlan, celebrant of this Mass, the congregation stand now to recite the profession of faith, the Creed

Offert.: The Prayer of the Faithful, intercessory prayers for the Church and community, conclude the first part of the Mass, the liturgy of the Word. The liturgy of the Eucharist begins now, with the Offertory rite in which the bread and wine needed for the sacrifice and sacrament of the Eucharist are brought to the altar and prepared by the clelbrant. The Offertory ends with the formal Prayer over the Gifts.

CHOIR

Preface: The Eucharistic Prayer, the central prayer and action of the Mass begins with an invitation and then the special Preface for these weeks of Advent: today it's the 2 Mof the 4 Eucharistic Prayers that you'll hear.

PerIpsum: That doxology, during which the celebrant holds the chalice and paten on which the sacred host, in a gesture of offering, concludes the Prayer of the Eucharist; the Communion rite begins with the recitation of the Our Father.


While the Communions continue, we still have a few minutes for reflection and prayer. Although attention to the Word of God recorded in the Bible, and concern for the difficulties and problems of the use of drugs and narcatics in HK claim special attention today, I would like to share with you some reflection on this sacrament of God's love we receive in this Advent season—and the object neither of Bible Sunday nor this anti-narcotis Day is really so far removed from this. For Advent, the coming of Christ, is one season most closely connected with an understanding of holy Scripture, and with Hope & confidence, virtues whose absence makes recourse to and dependence on drugs seem an understandable solution of life's difficulties. There is an obvious link to meditate on between the coming of Christ which is the Sacrament of the Eucharist.....

O Lord, stir up our hearts to accept the message of your only begotton Son, so that, through his coming on earth, we may serve him always with a pure intention; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

First Reading (Old Covenant):

A reading from the book of the prophet Baruch (5:1-9)

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on for ever the beauty of the glory from God. Put on the robe of the righteousness from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting. For God will show your splendour everywhere under heaven. For your name will for ever be called by God, "Peace of righteousness and glory of godliness."

Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height and look towards the east, and see your children gathered from west and east, at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them. For they went forth from you on foot, led away by their enemies; but God will bring

them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne. For God has ordered that every high mountain and the everlasting hills be made low and the valleys filled up, to make level ground, so that Israel may walk safely in the glory of God. The woods and every fragrant tree have shaded Israel at God's command. For God will lead Israel with joy, in the light of his glory, with the mercy and righteousness that come from him. — This is the word of the Lord.

And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruits of righteousness which come through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God. — This is the word of the Lord.

Third Reading:

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (3:1-6)

ALL: Glory to you, Lord.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, in the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the wilderness; and he went into all the region about the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways shall be made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." — This is the gospel of the Lord.
