30 dec. 1979 dec. 1990 Good morning from the Catholic Centre, this last Sunday, the year of the 70 1972 In a few moments we will be beginning In a few moments we will be beginning the Mass for today, which being the Sunday within Christmas, week is observed as the Feast of the Holy Family. For you who are listening to this broadcast because you're ill today or cannot join with your fellow-Christians in community celebration this morning, we hope that being able to join in spirit with the people here will be a help to you and a consolation. Whatever your faith, or none, on this last hay of the year here's an invitation to think over the year that's just ending in your life, with gratitude to God. The readings of scripture in the first part of the Mass for today come from the O.T. Book of Ben Sirach, from the N.T. letter of St Paul to the Colossians, and from St Luk's gospel -- there's a common theme of family life and the growing together of a community of faith, hope and love. But before we hear the scriptures, there's an introductory rite of prayer, repentance and praise of God, in which the message of Christmas also is recalled. This preparation begins now, with the singing of an Entry Song as the priest and his assistants approach the altar and made a reverence.

CHOIR

Intro.: Kyrie: Gloria: ORATIO The Aseembly Prayer for today's celebration and Festival. Everyone now sits down to listen to the first, D.T., reading; and this is followed by a mediation prayer from Ps 129.

CREED. After listening to the word of God in scripture, and the bomily given by Fr Harald Naylor, celebrant of this Mass, all now stand to recite together a profession of faith in God, the Nicene Creed. family prayes of the Clevel

OFFERT. The Prayers of General Intercession/conclude the first part of the Mass, which has been centred around the Word of God. Now at the altar the priest begins the preparation for the second part of the Mass, the Eucharist, with the Offertory rite: he takes the gifts of bread and wine, with a prayer and blessing over them., preparing them for the action and sacrament of the Eucharist, the Thanksgiving in which we recall and celebrate the great gift of God's love to us CHOIR

That formal Prayer over the Gifts ends the Offertory rite; PREFACE: and now begins the action and prayer of the Eucharist -- we will hear the special Preface for Christmastime, and the of the 4 Eucharistic Prayers.

PER IPSUM: That offering of prayer, worship and praise ends the Prayer of the Eucharist: now we begin the praparation for the sacrament of the Eucharist, reciting the Lord's prayer thou together.

COMMUNION: At the altar, the priest receives the sacrament of the Eucharist, taking the Body and Blood of Christ in the sacred Host he eats and the chalice from which he drinks. After a few moments he'll come to the altar-rail to give Holy Communion to those of the congregation here who wish to receive and are now filing up to the front of the chape: During the giving of Holy Communion, which will take some minutes, there is time for personal prayer and reflection; and you may like to join in spirit with the people here returning to their places with gratitude for the gift of God's love. Meanwhile, a hymn for communiontime

May the families of this parish become like Christ and grow in maturity, wisdom and grace by living for each other. Lord, hear us.

PRIEST: Almighty God, you are the Father of all men and you want us to live together as a family. Help your people to love one another and to be patient with each other. May Christ's message of peace become a reality within our homes. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

P. Lord, accept our gifts, and through the prayers of Mary, the virgin mother of God, and of her husband Joseph, bring security and understanding to our families. We ask this through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.

ALL: Amen.



First Reading

A reading from the Book of Sirach (3:2-6, 12-14)

The Lord honoured the father above the children, and he confirmed the right of the mother over her sons. Whoever honours his father atones for sins, and whoever glorifies his mother is like one who lays up treasure. Whoever honours his father will be gladdened by his own children, and when he prays he will be heard. Whoever glorifies his father will have long life, and whoever obeys the Lord will refresh his mother. O son, help your father in his old age, and do not grieve him as long as he lives; even if he is lacking in understanding, show forbearance; in all your strength do not despise him. For kindness to a father will not be forgotten, and against your sins it will be credited to you. — This is the word of the Lord.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians (3:12-21)

And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as you teach and admonish one another in all wisdom, and as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs with thankfulness in your hearts to God. A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (2, 22, 39-40)


ALL: Glory to you, O Lord.
