4th Sudday of Year Catholic Centee Broadcast

In a few moments the Mass for today will be beginning here, and we would like to invite all of you listening to your radio to join with us in our prayer and worship of God this Bunday morning. Especially if you are sick, or at home and unable to share with your fellow-Christians in their community celebration of Christian life today, this broadcast of Mass is intended to give you a chance to join in spirit with the people here, to help you in your own prayer to God./ After the Christmas season and all the 'special' Sundays we've been having recently, today is just an ordinary Sunday of the year; and the scripture readings for today's celebration of the Lor PER IPSUM: The Prayer and Action of the Eucharist ends, as always, with are from this year's semi-continuous reading of St Luke's gospel (with an D.T. passage selected to match the gospel), and from St Paul's Letters to Corinth -- today's extract happens to be the famous chapter 13, on God's greatest gift, of Love. But first, to prepare ourselves for a fruitful listening to the word of God, the Mass begins now with a service of prayer, repentance and praise to God. An entry song is sung as the celebrant Fr Cyril Barrett, with thee assistants, enters the sanctuary area of thechapel.

Good morning to you, from the chapel at the Catholic Centre.

CHOIR

Intro.: Kyire: Gloria: ORATIO The Assembly Prayer for today's celebrat All now sit down, to listen to the first of the readings of scripture, which is followed by a responsory from Ps 71.

After the scripture readings and the homily by the celebrant, CREED: of this Mass, Fr Cyril Barrett, a profession of faith is now recited in common, the Nicene Creed

OFFERT .: The Prayers of General Intercession which you've just been listening to conclude the first part of the Mass, the Liturg of the Word. At the altar now, the priest begins the preparation for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, receiving from the assistants the bread and wine offered in the name of all of us which will be used in the sacrifice and sacrament of the Eucharist. CHOIR

Preface: The formal Prayer over the Gifts we've offered completes the preparatory rite of the Offertory. And now, the action and Prayer of the Eucharist, beginning with an invitation to take part, and then the special Preface for Sundays of the Year.

> that hymn of praise and glory to God. As immediate preparation now for the sacrament of the Eucharist, we pray together the Lord's prayer, Our Father ...

COMMUNION: It's Communiontime now; at the altar, the priest first receives in Holy Communion the Body and Blood of Christ. Ther in a moment or two, he will go to the altar-rail, to give this Holy Communion also to the people in the congregation here who wish to share this Eucharist and who are now filing up to the front of the chapel. As they go, and return to their places, there is some little time for personal, private prayer now; you may like to use this time for your own prayer, as a communiontime hymn is sung..

CHOIR

While the priest continues and finishes giving Holy Communion to the people here, there's a little time left in which you might like to join me in some reflection of this Eucharist and

the readings of scripture we've listened to. What St Paul wrote about the gift of God's love is particularly apt for the Eucharist, which is in a special sense the Sacrament of Divine Love. Here Christ gives himself to each one, so that we may share His giving of Himself for the world on Calvary, share His risen life and love. The Eucharist is for now; it's also a pledge and beginning of the future, for Christ's life and love will never pass away, and He invites us to share with and through Him the eternal life of God. It is the same gift of which St Paul speaks, which we don't really grasp or understand yet, but which has begun. The qualities St Paul describes (Love is always patient and kind..never jealous, boastful, conceited, rude, selfish).. this is to be Christ-like and that's really the transformation which the Eucharist shd. bring about in is now. But the gospel has reminded us that Christ's love was for everyman, something that his own townspeople weren't able to accept: and in practice we too find it difficult.... perhaps it's because our hearts aren't open enough to others, to all others, that the transformation which Christ's gift of Himself to us in the Eucharist shd. be making in our Christian lives isn't yet so complete. The love of Christ comes to us, a gift for others; sharing His love with people, not just our own likings, we receive His gift more deeply. This Holy Communion, then, is never solely something between an individual and Christ; it eventually involves us in all of mankind, as we re-live in the Eucharist Christ's giving of Himself on His cross for every man. So let us pray that we may truly receive this gift of God with open hearts, and receiving, be open to sharing God's gift with everyone we meet

and speak with. May all of us <u>be</u> the prophets to our world which sharing Christ's life calls us to be, with Him. And in keeping with that, may we learn more and more to <u>give</u> as He has given to us. May we learn to und<u>erstand</u> His giving, and to be grateful and graceful in receiving and in sharing what we receive.

PRIEST: Almighty God, give the joy of coming salvation to your servants who grieve for the guilt of their sins. We make our prayer through our Lord.

ALL: Amen. (Sit)

Prayer Over the Gifts

P. Lord, may the gift we offer in faith and love be a continual sacrifice in your honour, and truly become our eucharist and our salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lod.




Entry Song

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (3:10-18)

(Theme: What, then, must we do?)


ALL: Glory to you, Lord.

The multitudes asked John, "What then shall we do?" And he answered them, "He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise." Tax collectors also came to be baptized, and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Collect no more than is appointed you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Rob no one by violence or by false accusation, and be content with your wages." As the people were in expectation, and all men questioned in their hearts concerning John, whether perhaps he were the Christ, John answered them all, "I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming, the thong of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor, and to gather the wheat into his granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, he preached good news to the people. — This is the gospel of the Lord.
