After the word of God in scripture and the homily given by Toseph Foley Foley Fr Seah Coghlan, the Creed; a profession of faith in God who gives us Light to see Him.

OFFERT.: The Prayers of General Intercession conclude the first part of the Mass, the liturgy of the Word; now, in the Offertoty rite, the liturgy of the Eucharist begins, with the priest taking the bread and wine which are required for the Eucharist and are provided through the gifts and offerings of the faithful, as signs of their offering of themselves to the service of God.

PREFACE: The Prayer over the Gifts, for today; ending the Offertory preparations, and leading into the central prayer and action of the Eucharist. There's a special preface for this 4th Sunday of Lent, and we'll hear the 3rd Eucharistic Prayer.

Per Ipsum: The concluding praise of the Eucharistic Prayer. And now the preparation for Holy Communion begins, with the community prayer of the Church, the Lord's Prayer.

Communion: After raising the sacred Host for the congregation's adoration the priest now receives Christ's Body and Blood in Holy Communion praying quietly as he does so: 'May the Body of Christ bring me to everlasting life' May the Blood of Christ bring me to everlasting life'. Meanwhile, people in the congregation here now begin to approach the altar for Communion; and there is a time here for quiet personal prayer and reflection as the giving of Holy Communion proceeds. You may like to use these few minutes for your wwn private prayer and reflection, in union of spirit with the communicants here; and in a few moments a communiontime hymn will be sung. The Eucharist here is a reminder too that Easter is the summit and goal of our observance of Lent, the Easter of this year and of our being finally and fully united with Christ in His Paschal Passover.
