And I'm sure he would enjoy that other recent biblical musical, Joseph & the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat — which by the way, you can hear some bits of, if you stay tuned after this programme to Aileen Bridgewater's 'Bit by Bit': she's kindly asked me to stay on and talk with her today about that and other things. And then there's the movie "Brother Sun, Sister Moon", which for some reason we've never yet seen in HK.
