## PRAYERS (Irish)

'To sing is to pray twice over' — that correct and extatation of one of the Fathers of the Church (I think it was) has been quoted a lot, as an encouragement to get people to join in the singing of parts of the Mass and of the public prayer of the Church. Perhaps its point is more easily seen if you've been, for instance, part of a large <sup>multinational</sup> crowd on a solemn occasion singing the Creed in unison. Not every musical setting makes a prayer more prayerful, though. But here's one, of the Lord's Prayer, Our Father, with the children's choir, which I think does help one to pray, twice over.
