Queen of Heaven rejoice - Alleluia || For He whom thou didst merit to bear,  
alleluia, Has risen as He said, alleluia || Pray for us to God, Alleluia  
Rejoice & be glad, Virgin Mary, alleluia, For the Lord has risen indeed, alleluia.  
God, who by the resurrection of your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, has brought joy  
to the world; grant we pray that through his Virgin Mother Mary we may  
obtain the joys of everlasting life: we ask this through the same Christ, Our Lord.

Today, I'd like first to read for you the full story, from St Luke's gospel,  
of those two disciples of Christ making their way out from Jerusalem on the  
first Easter Day. It's an incident rich in detail, in invitation to prayer and  
contemplation, and in instruction about our Christian life with Christ. And  
after listening again to the perhaps already very familiar gospel, an invitation  
to pray and reflect to music — a rather long meditation song which  
paraphrases the gospel story in contemporary words.
