

Earthly Vessels The Thursday before last, I was talking to you about the "Jesus Prayer". That's a well-known form of prayer in the eastern Orthodox churches : and I began quoting for you from a book which some years ago did a lot to popularise the Jesus Prayer in the West when it was translated from the Russian. The book was 'The Way of a Pilgrim', written early in the last century : and it tells of a devout Christian who tries to find out the meaning and the method of doing the instruction he heard and read in the Bible : "pray without ceasing". He tells how, first, he went to listen to a lot of learned sermons and lectures about prayer : but, he says, they were about prayer, but didn't tell him how to pray without ceasing. Eventually, he decided the best thing was to go and find a personal teacher who could really instruct him. And that's where I ended, on a note of suspense, last Thursday week.
