KANE: The opening bars of an oratorio about the patron saint of Wales,

St David, 'Dewi Sant'. It's for 3 soloists, chorus and orchestra, written in 1951 by Arwel Hughes, to a libretto by Welsh poet Aneurin Talfan Davies. It's the first in a short series of Sunday

morning Oratorios, on Radio 4, from 10:00 to 11:00

MUSIC: Elgar: Light of Life 97 R 02 # 1

KANE: The Meditation that begins the oratorio, The Light of Life by Sir

Edward Elgar. It was first heard in 1896, and is the featured work

in this Sunday morning's Oratorio presentation, second in a short series of Oratorios I'm introducing this month. You can hear it, slightly abbreviated, between 10 and 11 on Sunday

morning on Radio 4

## Sunday 20th May:

MUSIC: De Almeida – "La Giuditta" CD 18780 disc 1 # 1 at 4:39

KANE: The gory image of Judith holding the head of Holofernes that

she's just cut off is the subject of numerous classic European

paintings; and the Judith story a very popular one for

composers of oratorios from the 16<sup>th</sup> right up to the 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

The story's from the bible: and "Oratorio" this Sunday is a less violent version than most: "La Giuditta" by Francisco Antonio

De Almeida. Radio 4, 10:00 to 11:00

#### Sunday 27th May:

MUSIC: Beethoven -- Christus am Ölberge CD 65263 # 7

KANE: Beethoven wrote only one opera – and shortly before that, his

only oratorio, "Christ on the Mount of Olives", his op.85. It's not often *heard* these days, but you can hear it this Sunday morning here on Radio 4 --- the *whole* of it, in fact, for it's short enough to fit nicely into the weekly 'Oratorio' time-slot, from 10 to 11.

MUSIC: Einhorn -- Voices of Light CD 32147 #1 at 1:23 >

KANE: A different kind of oratorio this week on Sunday morning: the

most *recent* work in this short 'season' of oratorios, and one not based on a bible or religious story, but inspired by a 1928 silent movie classic, 'The Passion of Joan of Arc'. The libretto is texts from Joan herself and from writings of medieval women.

KANE: He's best remembered now as the second part of a very

unwilling partner who yearned for more serious music. Arthur Sullivan (of 'Gilbert & Sullivan' fame) is the composer of this

Sunday morning's ORATORIO, "The Prodigal Son", on Radio 4

MUSIC: Brixi --- Judas Iscariothes CD 70655 # 1

KANE: The cheerful Introduction for an oratorio you *might* have thought

would be more sombre and solemn --- written for performance on Good Friday, its maybe *unusual* subject is Judas Iscariot,

the disciple of Jesus who betrayed Him. It's the work of an 18<sup>th</sup>

century Czech composer and organist Frantisek Xaver Brixi who

composed many Masses, oratorios and requiems. 'Judas

Iscariot' is the Oratorio on Sunday morning, radio 4, 10 to 11.

#### Sunday 24th June 2007:

MUSIC: Mendelssohn --- Paulus CD 4634 disc 1 # 16

KANE: This grand setting of the old German chorale 'Wachet auf!'

is from Mendelssohn's first great oratorio, 'Paulus' (or St Paul) It's a key work in the on-going story of oratorio, *not* so familiar perhaps, as his later "Elijah". It's a long work, in two parts, the

first more *dramatic* than the second: you can hear most of part one in Sunday morning's ORATORIO, on radio 4, just after 10.
