"The dawn from on high shall break upon us". The words are from Zechariah's hymn of praise to God, a prophecy (St Luke says) on the birth of his son John. In the darkness of tonight's midnight, and in the dawn light of tomorrow morning, we celebrate Christmas. It's a festival of light, of Christ who is the Light of the world and who shines on "those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace". May this dawn always be new and fresh for us as we celebrate Jesus Christ, the Light of the world.
