It's happening, in more subtle forms, even in what people like to think of as the more modern "developed", "liberal", societies which ignore, discount or ridicule religious believers and their standards and principles. May we Christians be more aware of the subtle efforts to subvert our faith in God, the easy temptations to weaken our practice of faith, our devotion and dedication to Jesus' way. May He give us courage in proclaiming and upholding our Christian standards, faithful in following His ways and commandments. May we give witness to people around us that God does exist in our world and is with us, that He is our Father who loves and gives a fullness of life that's far beyond the worth of anything else we may desire or hope for.
